

antonym: *noun* a word opposite in meaning to another, e.g. *bad* and *good* (opp. **synonym**)

intransitive: *adjective* (of a verb or sense of a verb) that does not take or require a direct object (whether expressed or implied), e.g. *look* in *look at the sky* (opp. **transitive**)

synonym: *noun*

1. a word or phrase that means exactly or nearly the same as another in the same language, e.g. *shut* and *close*.
2. a word denoting the same thing as another but suitable to a different context or containing a different emphasis, e.g. *serpent* for *snake*, *kill* for *slay*.
3. a word equivalent to another in some but not all senses, e.g. *ship* and *vessel*.

transitive: *adjective* (of a verb or sense of a verb) that takes a direct object (whether expressed or implied), e.g. *saw* in *saw the donkey* (opp. **intransitive**)

verb: *noun* a word used to indicate an action, state, or occurrence, and forming the main part of the predicate of a sentence.
